#### **Power of Play**


"Play is our brain's favourite way of learning"

Play-based learning is an approach that emphasizes learning through play and exploration. It is child-led learning that ignites the child's creativity and brings wonder. It is a great way to engage the child and involve them in the learning process.

Various studies and research conducted in countries have proven that play-based learning results in higher student achievement.

Play also counts on the emotional well-being of the child.



The classroom learning spaces, environment, and learning engagements are designed to give higher importance to play.

The early years' classes are child-centric and below given are some of the ways that at Canary, our team infuses play-based learning:

1.Free play: Our learning spaces and environment have a strong emphasis on the loose parts eg. stones/pebbles, shells, blocks, or items which are reusable. These open-ended materials are great tools which pave the way to creativity and innovation.

2.Imaginative play: In order to boost children's imaginations we have pretend play corners. Various tools, toys, costumes and props are kept in the class to let the students engage in role play.

3.Exploratory spaces: Exploratory spaces in the classrooms give opportunities for children to explore, find out, make predictions and inquire about things. It builds independence and critical thinking in children.









- 4. Time flexibility: Students are given flexible time frames in the classroom to let them involve in authentic and uninterrupted play based learning. Teachers are involved in observing, recording and planning while the students are deeply engaged in playful activities.
- 5. Outdoor activities: Outdoor learning, activities and experiences are given prime importance as it develops personal and social skills and self regulation in children.
- Eg. Field trips,nature walk, sand play, physical activities like games, are conducted to give them more outdoor learning experiences.

Incorporating play-based learning in classrooms and homes requires supportive adults who act as facilitators rather than instructors. By observing and engaging with children during play, educators and parents can identify learning opportunities and provide guidance when necessary, all while encouraging independent exploration.

We are further planning on working on designing more play based learning spaces in the school. Do reach out to us if you are interested to be part in developing enriching experiences for our budding inquisitive minds!

#### **IB PYP WORKSHOP:**



The International Baccalaureate (IB) Making PYP Happen workshop is a comprehensive professional development program designed to equip educators with the necessary skills, knowledge, and strategies to implement the Primary Years Programme (PYP) effectively. On 21st and 22nd July 2023, twenty-seven teachers from Canary The School attended the IB in-school workshop on Making PYP Happen- Implementing Agency. The workshop was facilitated by an experienced IB Trainer (IBEN) Ms. Shefali Lakhina. This workshop equipped our teachers to design learning experiences for more in-depth inquiry for better understanding of the concepts, continuous assessment, implementing agency (Empowering students to voice, make choices and demonstrate ownership of their learning), and exposure to important elements of the IB.







#### WORKSHOP on ISRO at VNRVJIET:



Senior school students attended the ISRO scientists workshop at VNRVJIET Engineering College on 7/7/23. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) workshop was an exciting opportunity for students to explore the fascinating world of space research and technology. This field trip aimed to provide students with first-hand experience of ISRO's operations, different space missions and significant contributions to space exploration.
