Message from the SLT Team

From the PYPC

As an educator, the journey of learning never truly ends. In fact, it is essential for educators to embrace continuous professional development (CPD) in order to stay relevant, enhance their teaching skills, and provide the best possible education to their students. CPD goes beyond the initial qualifications and certifications, allowing educators to constantly grow, adapt, and excel in their profession.

At Canary The School, we understand the importance of continuous professional development for enabling our educators to meet the needs of 21st Century learners. Keeping this in mind, in the month of June 2023 our teachers went through 11 days of Professional Development Program. The teachers unpacked various elements of the IB Program such as Inquiry, Concept Driven Learners, Assessment, Key Concept and Related Concepts, IB Learner Profile, Approaches to Learning, The role of mathematics, Writing Process and 6 Plus one Trait of Writing, Literacy and Numeracy in the Early Years and Play in Early Years. Apart from these, the teachers also had wellbeing sessions, curriculum mapping, and classroom strategies for effective teaching and learning.



Continuous professional development is of utmost importance for educators. It also enables educators to stay abreast of the latest developments, teaching methodologies, and educational technologies. It provides educators with opportunities to refine their teaching skills and explore innovative strategies. By engaging in professional development, educators can learn new instructional techniques, classroom management strategies, assessment methods, and ways to differentiate instruction to meet the diverse needs of their students. Students today come from diverse backgrounds and have unique learning styles and needs. Continuous professional development equips educators with the knowledge and skills to adapt their teaching approaches and create inclusive and engaging learning environments ensuring that every student has an equal opportunity to succeed.

We have also registered our 26 teachers for IB Certified Professional Development Workshop which is going to be conducted on 21st and 22nd July 2023. The workshop will be delivered by an experienced IB Trainer. This workshop will equip our teachers to design learning experiences for more in-depth inquiry for better understanding of the concepts, continuous assessment, implementing agency (Empowering students to voice, make choices and demonstrate ownership of their learning), and exposure to important elements of the IB.

It was amazing to see our PYP Teachers taking ownership of their own learning, Sharing best practices among themselves, Demonstrating their love for learning as lifelong learners and living the IB mission in true sense.








4. Doctor's Day

Experiential Learning @ CANARY:

PYP Learning engagements:



EY: In the early years the brain develops through experiences. Students in the early years need a stimulating environment with plenty of different ways to play and learn. A child experiences joyful when engrossed in play. In Canary, the students from age group of 3 to 6 inventively play with anything and everything found in their environment. Teachers create learning spaces for students to develop their own personal interests, discover new things and promote language self-regulation.

Canarians learn through different ways to develop cognitive skills, Fine motor skills, Communication skills and Self-management skills.

Grade 1: As part of the inquiry into the ongoing theme of Who we are with the central idea: Families relationships contribute to shaping our identity. Students inquired about the different families and reflected on their understanding using the "Think, Puzzle, Explore" strategy by regrouping themselves. They have enhanced the Learner Profile attribute "Open-Minded" and developed communication skills.













Grade 2 :Sharing the planet was the theme with the Central idea - Changes in the environment cause various types of organisms to adapt. Canarians researched various types of organisms. They classified organisms based on the food they eat as herbivorous, carnivorous and omnivorous. They enjoyed sorting out the organisms. Canarians developed the Learner Profile attribute Inquirer. They gathered and recorded information thereby developing their research skills.



Grade 3: The "Weave a Food Web of an Ecosystem" was a class activity designed to enhance students understanding of the complex interactions between organisms within an ecosystem.

By visually mapping out a food web. Canarians grasped the interconnectedness of various organisms and recognized the crucial role of energy flow in sustaining life within a community. This activity helped the Canarians to construct a food web by identifying and linking together different organisms within a given ecosystem.








Grade 4 Learners read the book on body system during their Library class to analyse the facts how body systems are interdependent to work as a team and what will be the impact on other body systems if any one of the body system gets affected through certain disease. The learners developed their critical thinking skill and demonstrated the Learner profile "knowledgeable" during the task and came up with various conclusions how the malfunction of one system directly or indirectly impacts the other systems.
